The Sanstha, foundedon dry, bare land sixty years ago, has been transformed into the fertile land of knowledge and a centre striving for excellence in Higher Education under the visionary leadership of the former Principal Late M.V. Kaundinya and the torchbearer management founders. Former Chairman of Shikshan Prasarak Sanstha Late Shri. S. G. Joshi and Late Shri. Omkarnathaji Malpani laid downa sound and value-based academic foundation. Since 2006, under the stalwart leadership of honourable Dr. Sanjay Malpani, Chairman, Shikshan Prasarak Sanstha, our college has been setting and achieving high goals to meet global standards.

C. Analysis of various activities with respect to performance of the institution:

#### Curriculum Design and Development

- 1. The college currently offers 32 U.G., 18 P.G., 2 Certificate, 3 Diploma, 9 M.Phil and 10 Ph.D. programme in 3 disciplines. University Grants Commission has conferred autonomous status to the college from the academic year 2020-2021 for a period of ten years. 28 Board of studies have been constituted as per the guidelines of autonomy and the curriculum design and development of all the courses at all levels were completed. Syllabus revision was carried out for 46 Programmes and 549 courses.
- Outcome based Education is practiced in the institution. Programme Outcomes, Programme specific outcomes and Course outcomes have been drafted and mapped. The outcomes reflect the relevance to the local, national, regional and global developmental needs.
- 3. 666 students were enrolled for 21 value added courses. 1051 students have undergone field work/projects/ internships / student projects.
- 4. The Institution integrates cross-cutting issues into the curriculum

#### Academic Calendar

 Academic Calendar is prepared by the college before the beginning of the academic year and approval is taken from the Academic Council. It is available on the college website and notice board. It includes the dates of commencement and completion of syllabus, schedules of examinations and dates of various events

#### Faculty Profile and Quality

 Qualified and competent teachers are appointed as per the sanctioned numbers at our college. During the academic year 2021-22, 179 full time teachers were on roll out of which 57 have Ph.D. to their credit.

#### Mentoring

- 1. A mechanism for assessing the learning levels of the students is in place. The slow learners are identified as those who score less than average marks of the class. The advanced learners are identified based on the benchmarks set by the subject teacher. Assistance is offered to the slow learners in the form of assignments, bridge courses and counselling. The advanced learners are encouraged through student research scheme, internships, vidya dhan kalash yojana and awards.
- 2. 138 mentors have been assigned to the mentee. A record of mentor- mentee interactions and counselling is kept in the form of a counselling book.

#### Participative Teaching and Learning

The College creates a conducive environment for teaching and learning through learner centric
methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, problem solving methods using ICT
tools as needed.

Student centric methods adopted towards Experiential and Participative Learning Experience:

- · Experiential Learning:
  - Workshops: Workshops for students are routinely arranged to get the hands-on training under programmes such as DBT STAR college scheme.



- ii. Internships/On the Job training: Several students, especially of B. Voc. programmes, commerce and computer science go for internship and on the job trainings.
- iii. Study Tours and Field visits: Almost all departments take their students for field visits/ study tours. Department of Geography organize their practical in nearby villages. Department of Botany, Zoology, Physics, Chemistry, and Electronics etc. take their students for excursions.
- · Participative learning:
  - i. Socio-economic surveys: Department of Economics organizes socioeconomic surveys.
  - Mock Parliament: Department of Political Science promotes the students to participate in Mock parliament.
  - iii. Group discussions: Many students participate in Group discussions under evaluation methods of choice-based credit system. Problem Solving methodologies: Students are encouraged to take part in the Student Research scheme to develop the ability of analysis and problem-solving. Even during pandemic, the students used primary data to carry out student research.
- Problem Solving Methods:
  - i. Students undertake Project Work on problems realted to their subject domain supported by teacher guides.
  - ii. The students present the findings of their projects in Prin M.V.Kaundiya Research competition and Avishkar Research Convention.
  - iii. Group Discussions are organised to promote problem-solving and quest for generating new solutions.
  - iv. Case studies are used as effective tools to promote problem solving abilities.

#### Use of ICT in Teaching and Learning

1. The teachers make use of ICT for effective teaching with Learning The teachers of the college have made use of various Learning Management System viz. Moodle, Google Classroom, Canvas. The evaluation of the students has been carried out through google forms, Moodle, Canvas, and TestMoz. Use of Innovative hardware and software: To make teaching more effective some departments have used digital writing pads. Whiteboards (Zoom) and Jamboard (Google Meet) have been used effectively. The teachers have made use of software such as OBS Studio, Canva, open shot video editor and movie video editor for the development of E-content. Use of E-resources: Many departments such as Chemistry and Physics have made use of MOOC



Platforms, Digital Library resources (DEL NET, MYLOFT etc) and online web portals of IIT and Amrita Labs. YouTube Channel: The college has its YouTube channels which has several videos uploaded on it for the students. In additional several academic programmes are streamed live on the channel (https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC8erfKdVDhEQN4VbIMjb5hg).

#### Evaluation and reforms

- Board of Examination and Evaluation has been constituted and is active. The evaluation process
  is transparent and robust. IT has been integrated for the filling up of exam forms, seating
  arrangement, paper setting and result declaration. A dedicated portal of examination is available at
  <a href="https://exam.sangamnercollege.edu.in/">https://exam.sangamnercollege.edu.in/</a>. A examination calendar is prepared. A committee
  addresses the exam related grievances.
- 2. The pass percent of final year students during the year is 87.32%.

#### Research Promotion

- The college has an active Research Advisory Committee coordinated by Academic and Research Coordinator (ARC). The committee promotes the research in the college through activities such as Mini Research Scheme (Seed money for research), Avishkar research convention and student research scheme.
- 2. A Code of Ethics for Research is in place which is uploaded on the institutional website through the Research Committee.
- 3. The Ph.D. Research Centre of the college has 61 research guides out of which 29 as associate guides. 135 Ph.D students were registered during the year.

#### Innovation

- The college has a functional Institution's Innovation Council and the college also participates in the ARIIA ranking. The college has been recognized as Band Performer in the ARIIA rankings during the year.
- The college has a functional Institutional Innovation Council (IIC Registration ID: IC202014568)
  registered with Ministry of Education for nurturing and overseeing innovation and
  entrepreneurship.
- 3. 25 workshops/seminars have been conducted on Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Entrepreneurship and Skill Development during the year.



#### Research Publications

- 1. 46 Research Papers were notified in CARE Journals on U.G.C. website during the year.
- 2. 46 books and chapters in edited volumes / books was published during the year.
- 3. The total Scopus citations during the year are 437 with h-index of 47.

#### Consultancy and revenue generation

- 1. Rs.24.08 lakhs was revenue generated from consultancy and corporate training during the year.
- 2. Rs 26.59 lakhs was spent on developing facilities, training teachers and clerical/project staff for undertaking consultancy during the year.

#### Extension activities

1. 12 extension and outreach programmes were conducted by the institution through NSS/NCC/Red Cross/YRC, etc.in which 1674 students participated.

#### Collaborations

- 1. 8 collaborative activities were conducted during the year for research/ faculty exchange/ student exchange/ internship/ on-the-job training/ project work.
- 2. 9 functional MOUs with institutions of national and/or international importance, other universities, industries, corporate houses, etc., were entered into during the year.

#### Adequate infrastructure

- The institute has an adequate infrastructure for teaching and learning. The total construction area
  of the institution is 220838 sq. ft. There are 52 classrooms covering an area of 32605.69 sq. ft. The
  institution runs in two shifts. Therefore, an adequate number of classrooms are always available.
  All the classrooms are equipped with Wi-Fi connectivity and are LAN enabled. They have facitlites
  like LCD projectors and Smart boards.
  - 32 laboratories covering a total area of 27308.80 sq. ft. There are 10 computer laboratories covering an area of 5094.03 sq.ft. are available to offer computing facilities for the Department of Computer Science, BBA/BBA (CA), Physics, Mathematics, and Geography.
  - Department of Computer Science, BBA, BBA(CA), Physics, B.Voc (SD) and Library have computer labs and browsing centers. All departments have computers in departmental libraries.
  - The college has a Botanical garden with a rich diversity of flora. It is utilized for the botanical studies by Department of Botany.



A spacious Yoga Hall is available for Yoga activities.

2. The institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, Yoga, Sports, and games as described below:

Cultural Activities: For cultural activities, the college hasSaibaba Auditorium, Saibaba Open Theatre and Gandhi Mandela Open Theatre.

Yoga and Health: For yoga, a spacious Yoga Hall is available, Tagore Ashram is available for meditation. Madhavlal Malpani Yoga and naturopathy centre includes, Yoga therapy centers, seminar halls, yoga halls, and classrooms.

Sports and Games: The college has a huge playground with 8 lane track for athletics. The ground is utilized for games such as net balls, hockey, cricket, kabaddi and long jump. A basket ball ground is available. The indoor facilities include 16 station multi gym, Boxing ring, Table tennis, and Badminton court.

#### Library

The Library is completely automated through the ILMS provided by Vriddhi Software Solutions
Private Limited.

- 2. Institution has access to e-journals, e-ShodhSindhu, Shodhganga Membership, e-books, Databases, Remote access to e-resources.
- 3. 116 teachers and students visited library per day on an average.
- 4. Rs. 544525 were utilized for purchase of books/ e-books and subscription to journals/e-journals during the year.

#### Infrastructure Augmentation

- 5. Rs. 93.17 lakhs were utilized for infrastructure augmentation.
- 6. Rs. 30.51 Lakhs were utilized for maintenance of physical and academic support facilities, excluding salary component, during the year.



#### Infrastructure Maintenance and Policy

- The institution has a well drafted and approved policy on IT administration and management (APN/2019/4.2) uploaded on the institutional website. The purpose of the policy is appropriate use, maintenance, and up-gradation of Information technology related services to support Institutional functioning. IT resources require an investment of professional time and effort.
- 2. High speed internet connectivity is available in the institution. There are three services with 40 MBPS, 300 MBPS and 300 MBPS speed respectively.
